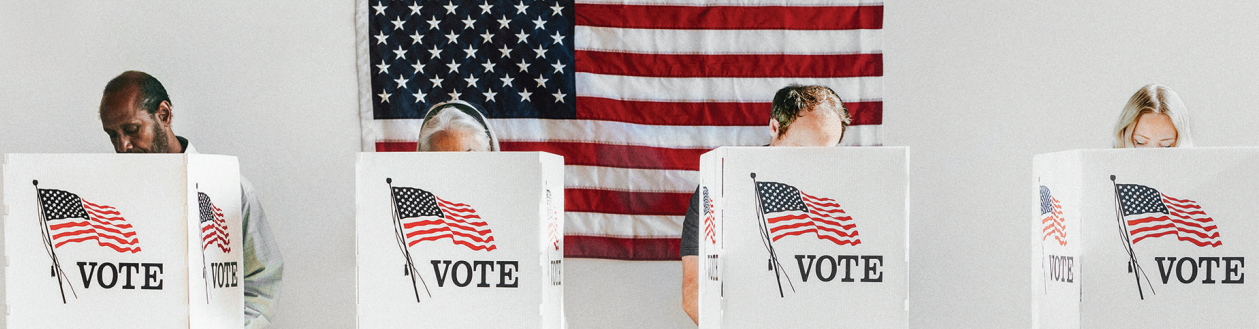

REGISTER TO VOTE

You can register online using your state-issued identification or driver's license. You can also change your address online if needed. This online option is available up until the two weeks preceding an election. During that two-week period – including Election Day – you will need to register in person at your city or township clerk's office.

To register to vote, you must:

1. Be a citizen of the United States;
2. Not currently be serving a sentence in jail or prison;
3. Be at least 18 years of age when you vote; and
4. Be a Michigan resident when you register and a resident of your city or township for at least 30 days before you vote.

To prove where you live in order to fulfill state and local residency requirements, you must present a document (hard copy or digital) that includes your name and current address.

Acceptable documents include:

- A Michigan driver's license or state identification card or
- A current utility bill or
- A bank statement or
- A paycheck or government check or
- Another government document.



HOW TO VOTE

Recent changes in Michigan's election laws mean that you have more options and opportunity to exercise your right to vote:

EARLY VOTING IN PERSON

Your city or township clerk will offer in-person early voting in a designated location for at least 9 days before every Election Day. After you mark your ballot, you can put it in the tabulator.

ABSENTEE VOTING

You can request an absentee ballot by contacting your city or township clerk. You don't need to provide an excuse for why you want an absentee ballot. Return your completed absentee ballot by postage-prepaid mail, via secure dropbox, or in person to your city or township clerk. A new option is to return your absentee ballot at your early voting site, where you can put your completed ballot in the tabulator. For your vote to count, your city or township clerk must receive your ballot by 8 p.m. on Election Day.

ELECTION DAY VOTING IN PERSON

Go to your polling place and vote in person. After you mark your ballot, you can put it in the tabulator.
